1. God honors a life of
2 Kings 18:5-7 (NLT), "Hezekiah trusted in the Lord, the God of Israel. There was no one like him among all the kings of Judah, either before or after his time. ⁶ He remained faithful to the Lord in everything , and he carefully obeyed all the commands the Lord had given Moses. ⁷ So the Lord was with him , and Hezekiah was successful in everything he did."
Psalm 34:15-17 (NASB) , "The eyes of the Lord are toward the righteous , and His ears are open to their cry . The face of the Lord is against evildoers, to cut off the memory of them from the earth. The righteous cry and the Lord hears and delivers them out of all their troubles."
2. Bring your battles to God in
2 Kings 19:14-19 (NLT), "14 After Hezekiah received the letter from the messengers and read it, he went up to the Lord's Temple and spread it out before the LORD. 15 And Hezekiah prayed this prayer before the LORD: "O LORD, God of Israel, you are enthroned between the mighty cherubim! You alone are God of all the kingdoms of the earth. You alone created the heavens and the earth. 16 Bend down, O LORD, and listen! Open your eyes, O LORD, and see! Listen to Sennacherib's words of defiance against the living God." 17 "It is true, LORD, that the kings of Assyria have destroyed all these nations. 18 And they have thrown the gods of these nations into the fire and burned them. But of course, the Assyrians could destroy them! They were not gods at all – only idols of wood and stone shaped by human hands. 19 Now, O LORD our God, rescue us from his power; then all the kingdoms of the earth will know that you alone, O LORD, are God."
Hebrews 4:16 (NLT), "So let us come boldly to the throne of our gracious God. There we will receive his mercy , and we will find grace to help us when we need it most."
Proverbs 18:10 (NKJV), "The name of the Lord is a strong tower; the

righteous run to it and are safe."

2 Chronicles 32:7-8 (NLT), "Be strong and courageous! Don't be afraid or discouraged because of the king of Assyria or his mighty army, for there is a power far greater on our side! ⁸ He may have a great army, but they are merely men. We have the Lord our God to help us and to fight our battles for us!" Hezekiah's words greatly encouraged the people."

2 Kings 19:35-37 (NLT), "35 That night the **angel of the Lord** went out to the Assyrian camp and killed **185,000 Assyrian soldiers**. When the surviving Assyrians woke up the next morning, they found corpses everywhere. ³⁶ Then King Sennacherib of Assyria broke camp and **returned to his own land**. He went home to his capital of Nineveh and stayed there."

Romans 8:31 (NLT), "What shall we say about such wonderful things as these? If God is for us, who can ever be against us?"

Psalm 46:2 (NCV), "God is our **protection** and our strength. He **always helps in times of trouble**. So, **we will not be afraid** even if the earth shakes, or the mountains fall into the sea."

2 Kings 20:1-6 (NLT), "About that time Hezekiah became deathly ill, and the prophet Isaiah son of Amoz went to visit him. He gave the king this message: "This is what the Lord says: Set your affairs in order, for **you are going to die.** You will not recover from this illness." ²When Hezekiah heard this, he turned his face to the wall and prayed to the LORD, ³ "Remember, O LORD, how I have always been faithful to you and have served you single-mindedly, always doing what pleases you." Then he broke down and wept bitterly. 4 But before Isaiah had left the middle courtyard, this message came to him from the LORD: 5 "Go back to Hezekiah, the leader of my people. Tell him, 'This is what the LORD, the God of your ancestor David, says: I have heard your prayer and seen your tears. I will heal you, and three days from now you will get out of bed and go to the Temple of the LORD. 61 will add fifteen years to your life, and I will rescue you and this city from the king of Assyria. I will defend this city for my own honor and for the sake of my servant David."
