Esther 3:1-2, 5-6 (NLT), "Sometime later King Xerxes promoted Haman son of Hammedatha the **Agagite** over all the other nobles, making him the most powerful official in the empire. <sup>2</sup> All the king's officials would bow down before Haman to show him respect whenever he passed by, for so the king had commanded. But **Mordecai refused to bow down** or show him respect. <sup>5</sup> When Haman saw that Mordecai would not bow down or show him respect, **he was filled with rage**. <sup>6</sup> He had learned of **Mordecai's nationality**, so he decided it was not enough to lay hands on Mordecai alone. Instead, he looked for a way to **destroy all the Jews** throughout the entire empire of Xerxes."

<b>Psalm 33:12 (NIV),</b> "Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord, the people he chose for his inheritance."
3. Seek God's approval over worldly
<b>Psalm 37:23 (NLT),</b> "The LORD directs the steps of the godly. He delights in every detail of their lives."
Esther 4:13-16 (NLT), "13 Mordecai sent this reply to Esther: "Don't think for a moment that because you're in the palace you will escape when all other Jews are killed. <sup>14</sup> If you keep quiet at a time like this, deliverance and relief for the Jews will arise from some other place, but you and your relatives will die. Who knows if perhaps you were made queen for just such a time as this?" <sup>15</sup> Then Esther sent this reply to Mordecai: <sup>16</sup> "Go and gather together all the Jews of Susa and fast for me. Do not eat or drink for three days, night or day. My maids and I will do the same. And then, though it is against the law, I will go in to see the king. If I must die, I must die."
4. Position yourself for God's
Esther 7:3-10 (NLT), " <sup>3</sup> Queen Esther replied, "If I have found favor with the king, and if it pleases the king to grant my request, I ask that my life and the lives of my people will be spared. <sup>4</sup> For my people and I have been sold to those who would kill, slaughter, and annihilate us. If we had merely been sold as slaves, I could remain quiet, for that would be too trivial a matter to warrant disturbing the king." <sup>5</sup> "Who would do such a thing?" King Xerxes demanded. "Who would be so presumptuous as to touch you?" <sup>6</sup> Esther replied, "This wicked Haman is our adversary and our enemy."
